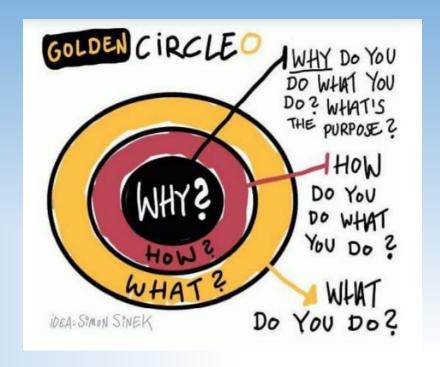

Outside-In versus Inside-Out Approach?????



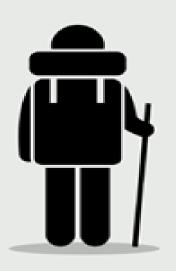
#### PACK:

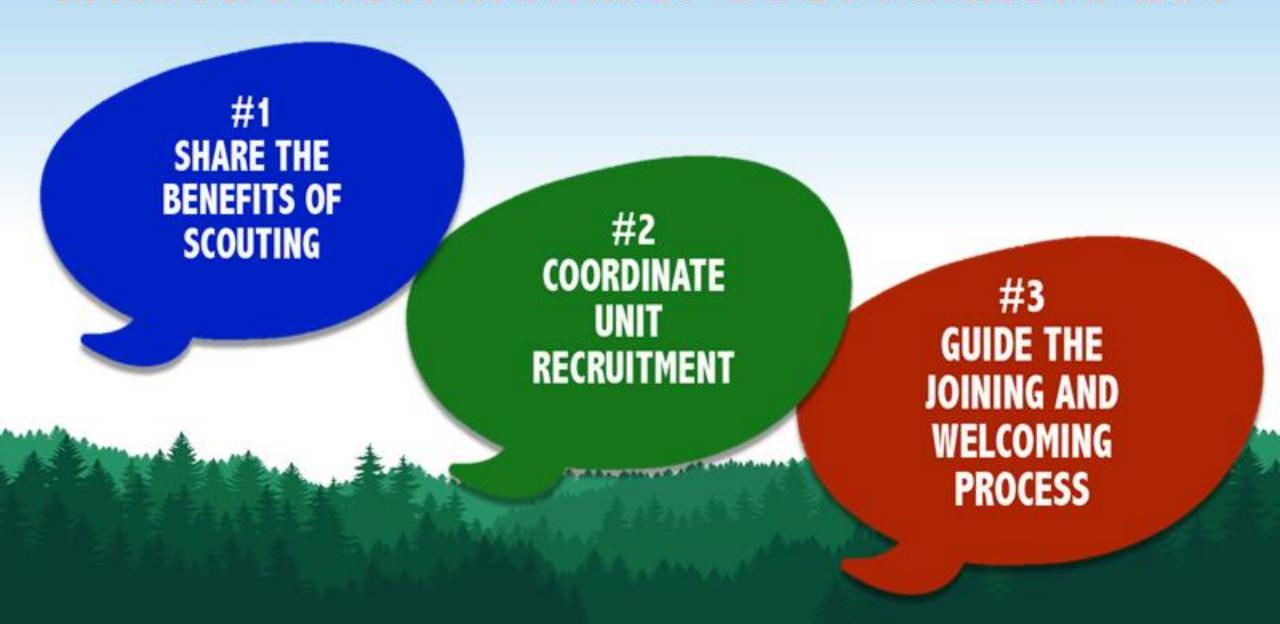






- There were a way to make your life easier as a leader and strengthen your unit at the same time

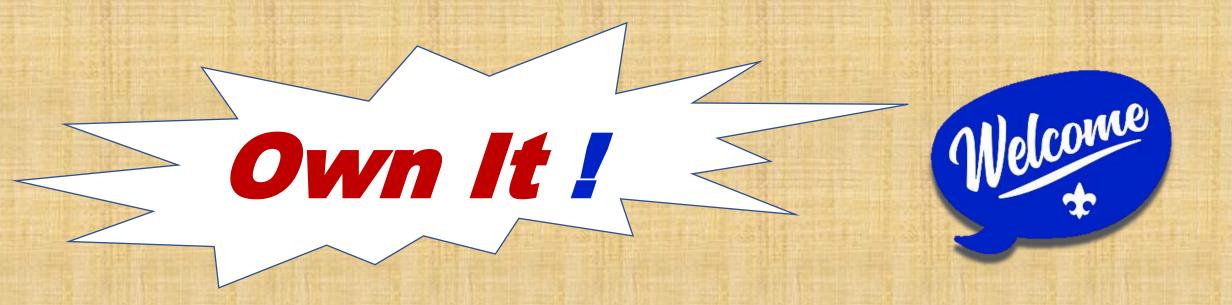

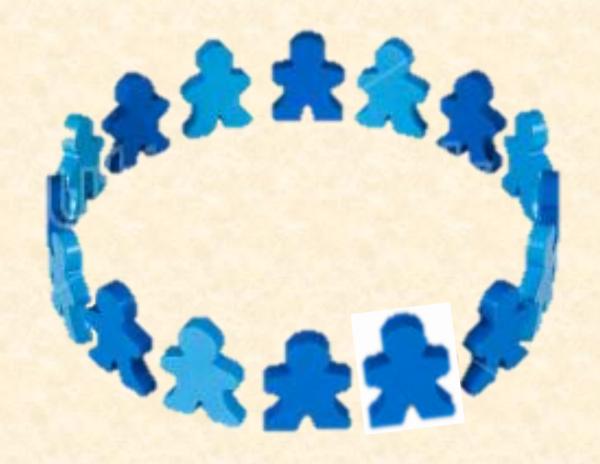
